ABOUT THE MARINE BIOLOGY PROGRAM

All of the activities we offer are included in the cost to help make it easy to budget for the trip with no unexpected costs.

Discover Eden will accompany you from airport pick-up to drop-off, offering guidance and support throughout your experience, making it as meaningful and rewarding as possible. The Discover Eden Marine Biology program is specifically designed for those who are either studying or working in the **ecological sciences, including zoology, botany, environmental science, animal science, marine biology, or biological sciences**.

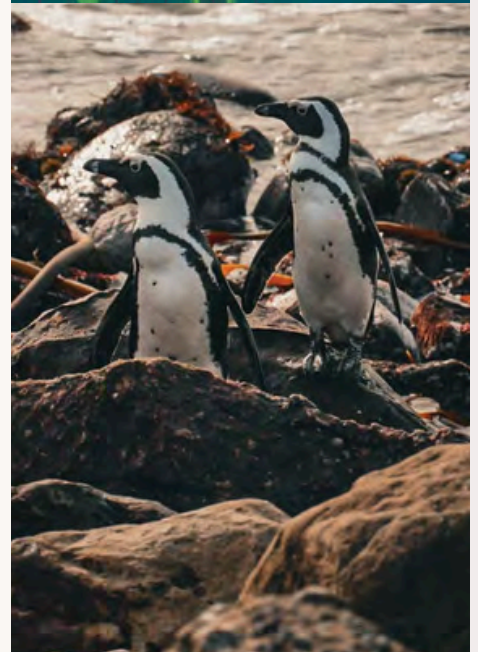
The program length is **2 weeks** and takes you out into the field to learn hands-on from conservation professionals. Learn while having a great time touring South Africa.

THE PROGRAM INCLUDES

MARINE BIOLOGY

- Spend several days with a team of marine scientists, getting foundational training and practical experience in several different marine biology research techniques.
- Be taken on a 'behind the scenes' tour of a world class seabird sanctuary. Here you will be given talks by one of the biologists and the vet nurse who is responsible for the wellbeing of the endangered African penguins and other sea birds at the centre.
- Visit a coastal nature reserve, which is also a natural penguin colony, where you will be given a talk by a marine specialist about marine conservation relating to endangered sea birds.
- Explore Africa's premier aquarium in Cape Town. Be taken on a special 'behind the scenes' tour of the aquarium by one of the aquarium biologists specifically to learn about turtle rehabilitation.
- Get training on free-diving research, collect, process and discuss data yourself.
- Learn about important work being done to counter the impacts of people on coastal biodiversity and assist in conducting monitoring work on beach research documenting marine debris, recording marine animal strandings, assessing breeding success of shorebirds and collecting waterbird data for a long-standing national citizen science program.
- Spend 2 days with marine biologists who work for an organisation that is heavily involved with marine conservation in their area. You could take part in activities such as shark tagging on a research boat or from shore, a snorkeling survey or dissection, an estuary survey or other relevant conservation-based activities.
- Spend a day with experienced whale watching guides, learning about the industry and how local research is assisting to make it sustainable. Get up close and personal with cetaceans that share our beautiful bay.
- Head out with experienced fish taggers to catch and release deep reef species.
- Sit and chat about careers in conservation and marine biology with Dr Mark Brown, as he shares his experiences of mentoring ecology and marine biology students for over 20 years.



WHATS INCLUDED

- Food: 3 meals a day.
- Accommodation.

HEALTH & SAFETY

- Discover Eden will have a guide with you from airport pick up to drop off.
- All travelling is done by the coordinators/guides.
- You will be required to sign an indemnity form on arrival.
- Hospitals and doctors are located in the nearest towns.
- Malaria: the tour takes place in a non-malaria region and you do not need malaria medication.
- You should consult your doctor for advice on vaccinations you might need before travelling to South Africa.

OTHER

Washing machine:

- A washing machine is available at certain areas during your trip at your own cost (approximately R60 per wash). Washing powder will be supplied per wash). Washing powder will be supplied.

Wi-Fi:

- Wi-Fi availability will be limited. It is recommended that you purchase your own local eSim or sim card at Cape Town International airport if you require constant internet access.

Weather:

- It can get cold in winter so you need to bring some warm clothes with you. In the mornings and at night it can be very cold, below 5° Celsius (41° Fahrenheit) During the day the temperature is mostly mild to warm at 18 - 26 ° Celsius (64 - 78° Fahrenheit).

ITEMS TO BRING ALONG

- Mosquito repellent.
- Light cotton clothing.
- Warm clothing for cold evenings and mornings.
- Preferably some old clothing that can get ruined.
- Hat/cap.
- Sunscreen - SPF 30 and higher a good choice.
- Swimming costume (at least two).
- Comfortable walking shoes.
- Hiking boots - high side that cover ankles best choice.
- A few pairs of old long trousers (or leggings) for walking in the bushveld.
- Waterproof jacket.
- A small backpack.
- Any special medication.
- Swimming towel.
- A refillable water bottle.

CURRENCY

ZAR (South African Rand) are used. If you need to exchange your currency to Rands, please do that at Cape Town International Airport as this is the only place you will be able to do it.

If you are going to also use your bank card while you are here, please remember to let your bank know that you will be using your card out of the country.

REQUIREMENTS

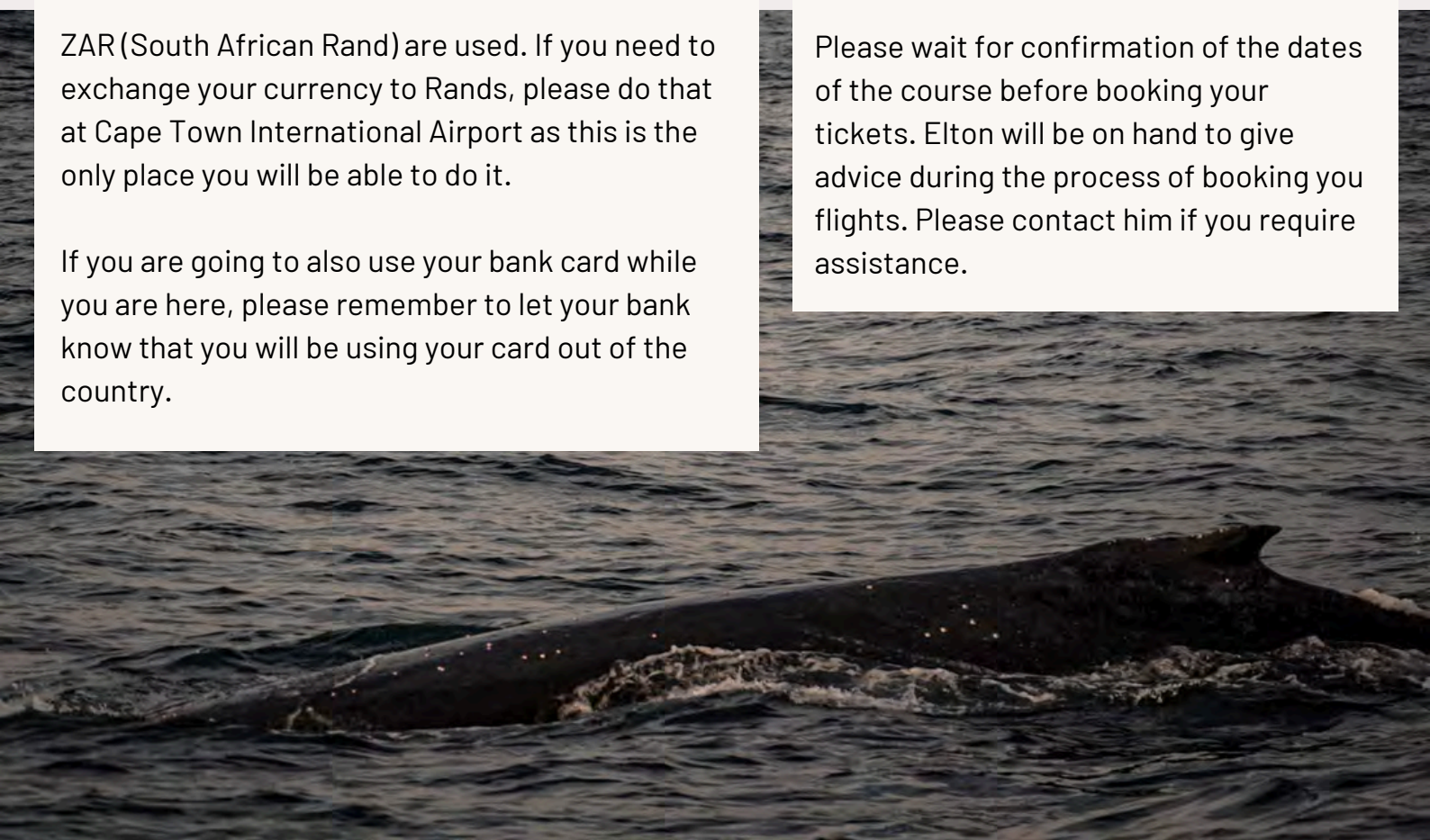
- Full travel and medical insurance.
